FROM OUR ASSOCIATE PRIEST

Dear Friends,

In his Epiphany hymn 'Songs of thankfulness and praise,' Christopher Wordsworth (Bishop of Lincoln 1868-1885), celebrates not one but three 'epiphanies' or 'manifestations' of the glory of Christ:

'manifested by the star
to the sages from afar;
branch of royal David's stem
in thy birth at Bethlehem...
Manifest in Jordan's stream,
Prophet, Priest, and King supreme;
and at Cana wedding guest
In thy Godhead manifest;
manifest in power divine,
changing water into wine:
anthems be to thee addrest,
God in man made manifest.'

In the Western Church the Magi, those exotic and mysterious figures from the East, students of the stars who have followed their star to find the boy born to be king of the Jews, have taken centre stage; inspiring artists and poets, hymn writers and musicians. As gentiles, they represent the peoples of the earth to whom the gospel is to be proclaimed. As men of learning, they represent human knowledge and wisdom offered back to the God who inspired it. There is a place at the manger throne for them to kneel alongside simple folk like shepherds and the devout like Mary and Joseph.

In the East, the emphasis is much more on the Baptism of Christ, which, together with the Wedding Feast of Cana, makes up a trio of epiphanies, or manifestations of the glory of Christ. The first, which marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, we celebrate this Sunday; the second, with the first of Jesus' 'signs' in John's Gospel, on the following one. As I am preaching on both of these Sundays, I will say no more about them for the moment.

The whole of Jesus' life, including his passion, death and resurrection, is in fact an epiphany of the glory of God: so we celebrate and meditate on that manifestation in word and sacrament, in prayer and study through the whole cycle of the Christian year. And when we have reached the end, we begin again, for we can never exhaust its meaning.

On your behalf, I thank the clergy who served the parish while I was away over Christmas: Archdeacon Mark Steadman, taking a break from his duties in the Archbishop of York's office; Archdeacon Gavin (who loves in the parish); and our own Archdeacon Geoff Arand. Not many parishes can boast of having three archdeacons ministering to them over Christmas! Thanks to Carolyn Jones and Su Toogood for leading the Crib Service; and to choir and organists, sacristans and Churchwardens, and our parish administrators, for their contributions to our Christmas celebrations.

Thanks also, to Sue Humphrey, who now that she has retired from her role as parish administrator, is

returning to her ministry as one of our Authorized Lay Ministers. She led an evening reflective service on the Epiphany with music from the ecumenical monastic community at Taizé in France. The worship and education committee meets later this month and will be looking at expanding our range of occasional evening services.

Looking forward, we have news of the latest of our ordinands, Fran Bell. She is to be ordained deacon to serve in the parish of St. Michael and St. Paul, Alnwick in the Diocese of Newcastle.

As someone who has served most of his ministry in parishes which produced a steady stream of ordinands, I know this always causes mixed feeling: there is a proper pride in giving them to the service of the wider Church; yet, at the same time, a regret that we are losing people who have made a substantial contribution to the life of our parish and diocese, and we wonder how they might be replaced. We must pray that the Lord will provide!

Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

GOSPEL READING

LUKE 3:15-17, 21-22

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

MARK 1:29-39

As soon as they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told Jesus about her at once. He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

That evening, at sunset, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. And the whole city was gathered around the door. And he cured many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. And Simon and his companions hunted for him. When they found him, they said to him, 'Everyone is searching for you.' He answered, 'Let us go on to the neighbouring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do.'
